Welcomes, Introductions, Announcements were made.

Celeste opened the meeting and asked if anyone had anything to share. Jackie Wydola and Jassie Hurlbert from Autin 17 House gave a review of things happening at Austin 17 House and agreed to come back and present at another meeting.

Celeste then introduced today's speaker, Dr. May Delaney of Worcester State University and RCFY Evaluator. She presented the updated YRBS Data from the Middle and High Schools. Marijuana is back up a little at the Middle School but the High School is seeing a downward trend. One reason may be that Vaping is replacing the MJ cigarettes because MJ can be vaped and is hard to recognize and easy to carry.

Both schools have students stating not only the curiosity factor when using these products but the stress and anxiety levels they are experiencing.

There was a lot of discussion about the additives in vapes and edibles, as well as the level of THC found in these products. It can be as high as 99.9%.

There is a free course offered by UNH Extension Service called Mental Health First Aid and can be accessed at extension.unh.edu.

YouTube has a 10 Year Colorado Study on legalization of Marijuana and the impact in their state.

There was also some discussion on Project Safeguard for this school year and what are some of the topics that would be most relevant.

Pam Baker then updated everyone on some of the things happening with the Youth Action Groups.
