This work is only made possible because we do it together. RCFY works to break down silos and encourage people to work together to have a greater impact. Working together we are much stronger and far more effective.



Positive Adult Interactions and Relationships



DATA tells our RCFY success story. In 2000, the University of NH had a two year grant to come to Raymond and work with community leaders to address data collected through the Youth Risk Behavior Survey. The data revealed that Raymond students reported higher than state average substance misuse. When the two year grant ended, and UNH was leaving, the leadership group became known as the Raymond Coalition for Youth, born in the summer of 2002. RCFY continues to work with our school district to collect this data to track areas of concern and put strategies in place to help create positive change. The chart below reflects the success of our hard work and highlights when new substances have popped up on our radar demanding outreach, awareness and resources to support our youth.


Youth Action–Middle School

We all play a role in mental health and suicide prevention. The first step is simply talking. We can check in on our friends and neighbors. You don't need to have all the answers to reach out.



Be willing to listen. Be a safe person for others to come to when they are feeling lonely, stressed or anxious. Be open and non-judgmental.



If someone is acting down; acting different; not doing things they used to love; having changes in sleep; shutting people out; you can help.

Providing Policy Awareness and Education

We have come a long way from the Saturday morning "I'm just a bill" awareness campaign. RCFY Youth members put their voice into action and spoke up about issues that are important them. They want their legislators to be informed and aware of how issues impact their lives, their friends and family. This legislative session youth members went to the Concord State House and shared stories and information of what marijuana products look like today and how they impact their world. It takes a lot of courage to stand up and speak about what is important to you, especially to a room full of adults. Our Youth Action members were engaged, educated, and empowered and they have a message, "Marijuana legalization does 't have to happen if people speak up. " NH HB 1598 to legalize marijuana was voted down this year.






