Celeste then introduced Sarah Cain from New Futures. Sarah talked about bills now being proposed and how you can advocate for them. Some of the things being discussed is the 5% for the Alcohol Fund and the discussion around the Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS). There was also discussion around a proposed tax proposed to fund the 988 phone number. This would be similar to the tax already in place to fund the 911 number.

Sarah then passed out information on how to sign up for Action Alerts and impactful ways of Advocating. She also mentioned submitting written testimony and what an impact it has.

Celeste then talked about The Exeter Hospital Youth Focus Group Review. There were 10 students from Raymond composed of Juniors and Seniors. They discussed Physical and Mental Health, Healthy Eating, What Stops You From Being Mentally Healthy, Resources, Substance Use, Messaging and Other Issues.

Pam Baker then updated Youth Action and what they are working on right now. Attending the "Getting to the Y" conference. Middleschool working on "Take Down Tobacco, I choose to be Vape Free".

June 2 is the Granite Youth Alliance Film Festival. Both the Middle and High School YA groups have entrees.

Kristen Buckman from the Library mentioned some of the programs she is offering, Teen Game Night and a Talent Show.
